Injured jockeys released from hospital after falls: Report

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — The two jockeys injured in a spill on Thursday have been released from the hospital, according to the Louisville Courier-Journal. Irving Moncada and Emmanuel Giles both were carted off via ambulance after falling on Thursday afternoon.

Moncada's agent told the newspaper that Moncada had been knocked unconscious in the spill, and only regained consciousness at the University of Louisville hospital. After a battery of tests, he was released Thursday night.

Giles injured his shoulder and spine, and was awaiting X-rays and more testing, according to the report.

Both horses, Territoriality and Vostra, were uninjured.
